Weekly Reflection

It's interesting that people have a tendency to judge others, sometimes mildly or perhaps quite harshly.

The reasons can vary from having a bad day, being tired, frustrated, or thinking less of the other person.

Scripture warns us against judging others, adding that the measure we give is the measure we shall receive (Luke 6:38).

Yet, have we stopped to look at the possible reasons for this?

In the parable of the Ungrateful Servant in Matthew 18, a servant is forgiven a huge debt. Undoubtably very pleased with removing such a heavy burden.

However, that same servant turns to a fellow servant demanding payment owed that was a mere small fraction of what he was just forgiven.

Nevertheless, he stayed by his demand and called for his fellow servant to be imprisoned until all is paid.

The end of the parable has the master learning about the events and then punishing the first servant by requiring the original payment.

If we truly realize that Christ died for all humanity, then we should recognize every one has been forgiven the same huge debt.

That forgiveness is given as the standard that we should follow. Our actions and words, therefore, become the measure of mercy we give to others. In the end, that same measure is what we get back. Hopefully, we make the correct investment.
