Weekly Reflection

Carol's father had a fall that would lead to him having an emergency surgery to relieve the pressure on his brain. Sadly, he was in a coma and the medical staff said he was brain dead and was not aware of his surroundings.

After the hard decision to take him off the ventilator, the family gathered and shared stories about Dad, as he breathed on his own.

Hours later, my mother-in-law asked that the television be turned on for background noise.

Around 5:45, Mom asked for channel 4 to be on, as it was Dad's favorite...especially being employed there.

At six o'clock the music intro came on and then the lead story. It was at that time Dad's breathing became very shallow and soon died.

A few days later at the funeral home, some of Dad's co-workers from WIVB came to pay their respects. When we shared his last hours, several co-workers just looked at us in amazement and said, "he went home."

We were a bit confused, so they shared that as he neared retirement, Dad did not work until his usual 6:30, but rather cued the music intro to go into the lead story, and then went home.

We then understood what his co-workers meant. More importantly, the doctors were wrong because he had to be cognizant to know when to "go home".

It is encouraging because stories like this tell us there is something beyond what we see from this life, and that our faith is not in vain. God is real, and His promises are real!

There will be a resurrection and a life with our Lord and Savior for all eternity.
